



Our Methodology

- Special data request to Primary Companies for confidential employment, wage, vendor spending, and production and investment expectations data
- Special request data from Department of Labor and Workforce Analysis
- State of Alaska and local government tax and royalty revenue data
- Public Environmental Impact Statements and other industry-related publications such as U.S. Energy Information Administration
- IMPLAN, industry standard input-output modeling tool adjusted for the Alaska market and regional distribution of impacts



State of Alaska Oil- and Gas-Related Revenue and Alaska North Slope Oil Price, SFY2013-SFY2022



Key Statewide Findings




In 2022, Primary Companies directly...

Employed Alaskans	 Employed 4,105 workers in Alaska, earning \$1.1 billion in wages 3,402 were Alaska residents, 83% of "Primary Company" employment
Spent with Alaska Vendors	• Spent \$4.6 billion with more than 1,000 Alaska vendors
Supported Government	 Paid \$4.5 billion to state and local governments, including \$4.1 billion in taxes and royalties to state government \$449 million in oil and gas property taxes to local governments

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



How the Oil and Gas Industry Impacts Alaskans




1 Direct Oil and Gas Job Supports 15 Additional Jobs in Alaska



Total Jobs Impact




The Future of Alaska's Oil & Gas Industry 2023-2028



Construction Phase Impacts 2023-2028

- Projects will directly employ an annual average 1,600 workers
 - Construction and drilling employment
 - Higher number of workers on-site during winter
 - Earning a cumulative \$1 billion in wages
- Including all multiplier impacts, projects will support between 2,600 and 2,900 workers each year

Expected Oil- and Gas-Related Capital Expenditures (\$Billions), 2023-2028





Production Phase Impacts 2023-2028

- Primary Company direct employment expected to increase by about 300 direct jobs and \$65 million in wages by 2028
- Including all multiplier impacts, new production will support about 2,700 new jobs and \$215 million in wages in Alaska by 2028



In Summary



Alaska's Oil & Gas Industry continues to be...

A Significant Source of Jobs

69,250 jobs and \$5.9 billion in wages

16% of all jobs and 17% of all wages in Alaska Alaska's Sector with the Highest Economic Impact

Each Primary Company job supports 15 jobs

\$1 in Primary Company wages supports \$4 in wages

Part of Alaska's Future

With \$14 Billion invested, by 2028 new production will support...

+2,700 total jobs annually +\$215 million in total wages annually*



* Includes Pikka Phase 1 production impacts and other projects and infield development in production in 2028, excludes Pikka Phase 2 and Willow production jobs expected to occur following 2028.
