

Regional Transportation Network



Phase I and Phase II

Phase I:

- 1.74 mile long bridge
 - 2 lanes w/shoulders (44 ft. width)
- 10 miles of roads and connections
- Cut and cover tunnel under Gov't Hill


Phase II (Not Included in this Financial Plan):

• Expansion to four lanes

Right-of-Way


- 85% of ROW secured
- Remaining Parcels are Government to Government (UA, JBER, MOA, ARRC)

Construction Cost Estimated (risk adjusted) – \$894 million (Phase I) based on design-build contract

Federal TIFIA Loan

- Secured w/ toll revenue only
- Interest rate: currently 3.66%
- Up to 35 year term after substantial completion
- Up to \$350M available
- Senior lien on toll revenue



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TIFIA- Transportation Infrastructure Finance & Innovation Act

Toll Bridge Revenue Bonds

- Bonds issued by DOR
 - Credit rating: AA+
 - Bonds issued after construction contract awarded
- Recent indicative interest rates: 3.36%
- Term: 20 years to maturity
- Annual debt service: \$20 million
- Dual pledge of appropriation credit and subordinated lien on toll revenue

Bonds

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 Toll revenue will eventually repay the full amount of bond debt

KNIK ARM CROSSING

Federal STIP Funds (NHS)

- \$55 million in Governor's FY15 Capital Budget proposal (SB 119)
- \$50 million per fiscal year up to \$300 million



NHS – National Highway System


Toll Revenue Forecast (50 Years)



Design-Build Project Delivery Method

- Design and construction services are contracted by a single entity – the design-builder
- Builder retains design risk
- Faster delivery
- Other Design-Build Projects:
- Glenn/Parks Highway
- Eagle River Bridges
