Explosion in 'world middle class'

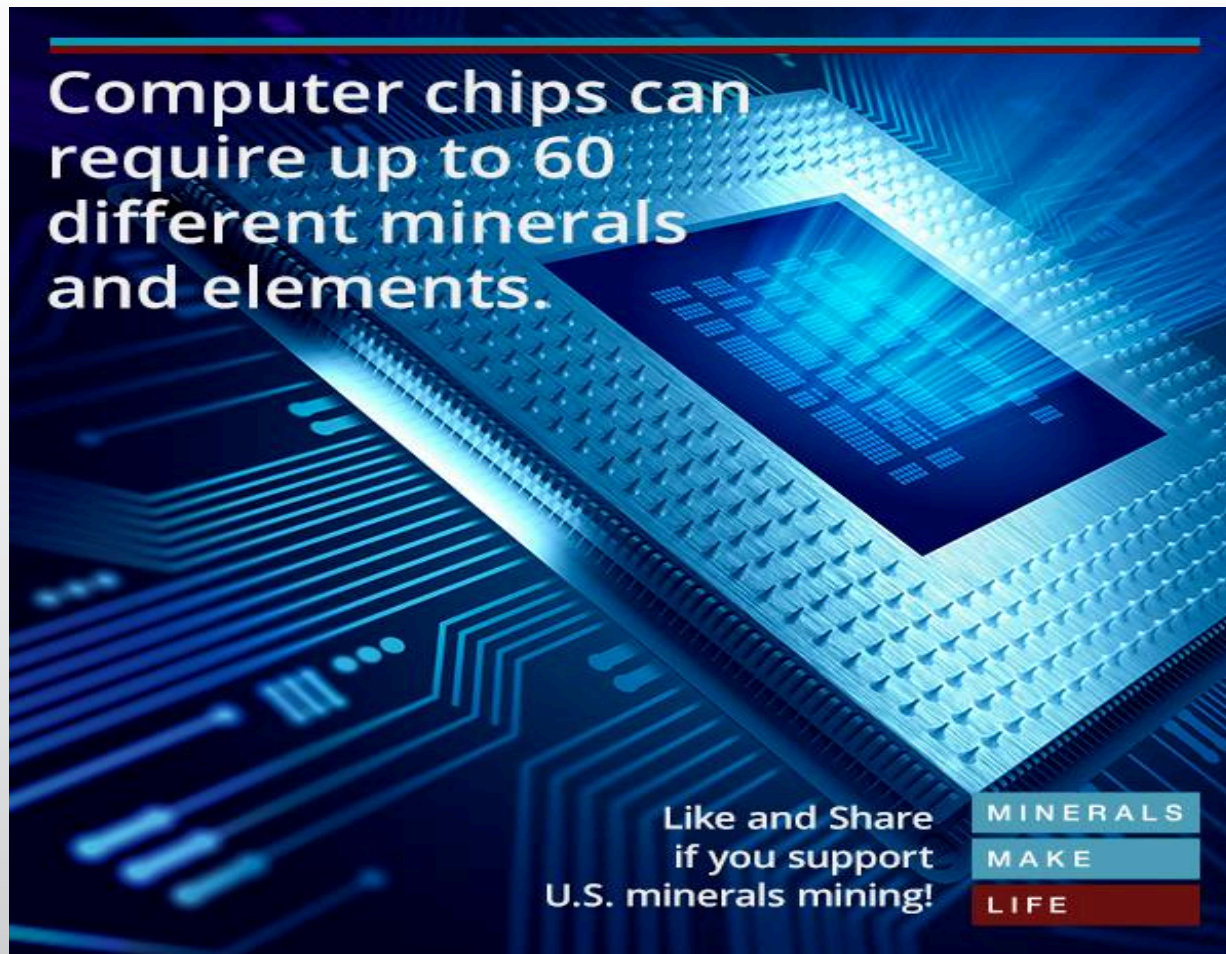
Rising middle class in developing world is shifting global consumption and supply patterns

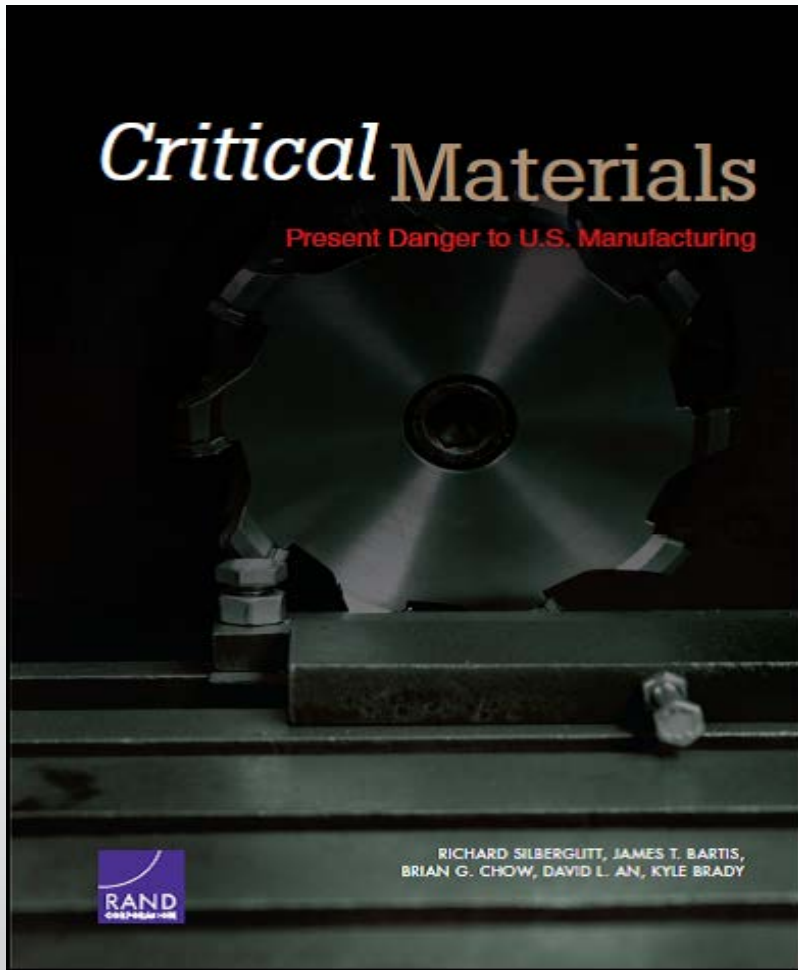

Substitutes: Few and Inferior

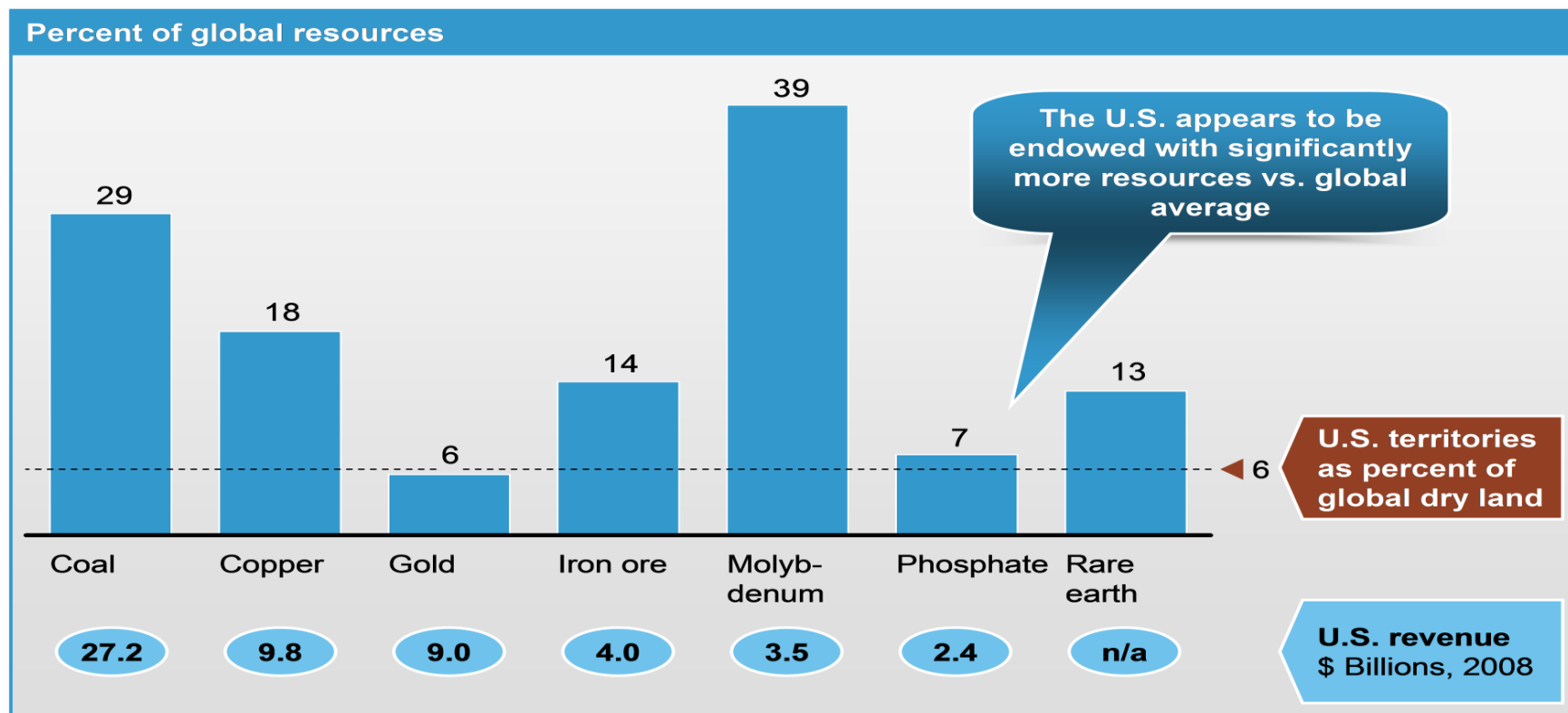


- Yale University: *Materials Basis of Modern Society* (2013)

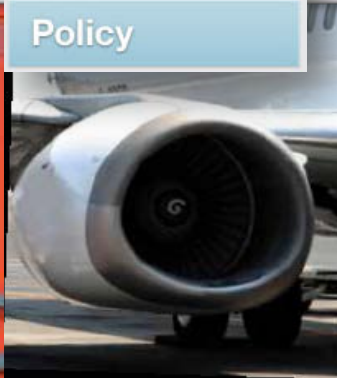
