






Alaska North Slope Fields

PERSPECTIVE OF THE PIKKA UNIT





2018/19 Work Focused on Maturing Pikka

RESOURCE ESTIMATES





- » Two-rig exploration program
- » Drilling two appraisal wells
 - 2 surface locations
 - four penetrations
- 25 miles of ice roads
- » 3 ice bridges
- y 4 ice pads
- » Program will define volumes for FEED decision in 2Q19. Current estimates are:
 - 500 mmbbl gross resource, with upside potential subject to results of Pikka B & C
 - 120,000 bopd production plateau



Pikka B



- » 6 miles from Nuiqsut
- » Began drilling 31Dec
- » Doyon's Arctic Fox rig






Pikka C



- » 13 miles north of Pikka B
- » Nabors 105 drilling rig
- » Scheduled to spud Jan 20



Putting Alaskans to Work




- » 36 Alaska companies are currently contracted for this appraisal season
 - Supporting ice roads, drilling, materials, etc.
- » 62 Alaska companies have been contracted to support drilling and development to date.
 - Number will increase soon as we look toward pre-FEED.
- » ~260 individuals currently working on the North Slope in support of Pikka B and C







Pikka Development




- » Proposed initial development includes3 drill sites
- » Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for Pikka Unit development is final
 - Awaiting USCG 404 permit needed for final project Record of Decision, anticipated 2Q 2019
- » Pre-FEED optimization studies underway

- Staffing estimates
 - > 200 employees during FEED 2019 2020
 - > 1300 workers combined drilling & construction 2020 2023
- Major focus on Alaskan partnerships and contractors
 - Exploring opportunities to collaborate
 - Community investment is a priority for OSA
